COURSES AT SWTAFE

Attend an information session to chat to our teachers and find out more about the course. You can find an upcoming information session near you at swtafe.edu.au/infosessions.

Apply at a SWTAFE campus or via our website at swtafe.edu.au.

SWTAFE staff will contact you to organise your interview and pre-training review.

Complete the enrolment form provided to you.

Provide your identification and concession card required to enrol.

Pay your fees (either upfront or on a payment plan).

APPRENTICESHIPS + TRAINEESHIPS AT SWTAFE

Find a job as an apprentice or trainee through an Apprenticeship Centre or Group Training Company.

Register with an Australian Apprenticeship Support Network (AASN) and nominate SWTAFE as your training provider (your employer will usually do this for you).

Receive your AASN registration number, which is called a 'Delta Number'.

SWTAFE staff will contact you to organise your pre-training review (once your ASSN registration is complete and you have received your 'Delta Number').

Complete the enrolment form provided to you and provide your identification.

Pay your fees (either upfront or payment on a payment plan). These payments can be made by you or your employer.



ENTRY AND SELECTION REQUIREMENTS

Each course has its own specific entrance and selection criteria, so it's important you review these requirements before applying.

Most courses will identify a minimum literacy or numeracy level as an entrance requirement.

Some courses may specify additional application requirements.

These include but are not limited to:

- Compulsory information session
- Interview
- Folio
- Course specific test/assessment
- Prerequisite units or courses
- Police check or 'Working with Children Check'

FREE TAFE COURSES AT SWTAFE IN 2019

Free TAFE gives more people a chance to get the skills they need to land a job that's in demand.

From 1 January 2019, Free TAFE covers tuition fees for priority courses for students who are eligible for government-subsidised training.

FREE TAFE ELIGIBILITY

Any Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or New Zealand citizen is eligible to do a Free TAFE for Priority Course if they meet some simple eligibility criteria.

If you don't meet the criteria you may qualify for an eligibility exemption. An exemption will enable you to receive a Free TAFE place in 2019.

Please note: The Free TAFE for Priority Courses initiative will pay your tuition fees for only one course. Once you have enrolled in a tuition-free priority course, you cannot get a tuition-free place again, even if you do not finish your first tuition-free priority course.

TAFE STUDENTS CAN EARN MORE

If you have a certificate or diploma from TAFE, you could start your career with a full-time wage of \$56,000 compared with \$54,000 if you have a bachelor degree from university.

9 of the top 10 occupations predicted to have the most job growth in the next five years are in TAFE-trained jobs.

More than one-third of job vacancies in the construction, food production and automotive trades went unfilled in 2015-16.

AGRICULTURE

Certificate III in Agriculture FREE TAFE

AHC30116

LOCATION Colac campus & Glenormiston DURATION Part-time, two years, one day

a week

START DATE Throughout the year

This qualification provides a general vocational outcome in agriculture. The qualification enables you to select a livestock production, cropping or livestock context as a job focus or, in the case of mixed farming enterprises, both cropping and livestock.

Certificate III in Agriculture FREE TAFE (Dairy Production) AHC30216

LOCATION Colac campus & Glenormiston DURATION Part-time, two years, one day

a week

Start date: Throughout the year

This qualification provides you with the skills and knowledge to work in the dairy industry. This qualification equips you with a variety of agricultural skills pertaining to the dairy industry including animal nutrition, animal health and machinery operation.

Certificate IV in Agriculture FREE TAFE

AHC40116

LOCATION Colac campus & Glenormiston DURATION Part-time, one year, one day

a week

START DATE Throughout the year

The Certificate IV in Agriculture will allow you to develop skills and knowledge to become a specialist in the agriculture industry, possibly becoming a supervisor or team leader.

This course also covers the specifics of managing stock nutrition, breeding, health and welfare and supervision of staff and plant operation.

Diploma of Agriculture AHC50116

LOCATION Colac campus & Glenormiston DURATION Part-time, two years, one day

a week

START DATE Throughout the year

Agriculture makes up 60 per cent of the regional economy of south west Victoria. The need for qualified staff is growing and SWTAFE graduates are in demand from farms to agricultural service providers. Students who complete this qualification will have valuable skills including:

- livestock and pasture management, breeding strategies, pest and disease control in crops,
- financial management and quality assurance.

Previous experience in agriculture is necessary and access to a commercial farm is preferable to support the learning at this level.

Certificate IV in Wool Classing AHC41316

LOCATION Locations on demand

DURATION Full-time, 12 months, three hour

weekly night classes

START DATE Throughout the year

Do you want to be responsible for providing premium quality wool to the Australian market? The Certificate IV in Wool Classing will equip you with skills needed to manage all shearing shed operations or apply for job opportunities in the wool buying, marketing and production industries. As a SWTAFE wool graduate, you will be eligible to apply to the Australian Wool Exchange for registration as an Australian Wool Classer. You will be a specialist in grouping fleece according to length and thickness, quality, colour, strength and cleanliness.

Arts

VISUAL ARTS

Certificate III in Visual Arts: CUA31115

LOCATION Colac campus

DURATION Part-time, two years, one day a week

START DATE February

The Certificate III in Visual Arts equips you with a broad range of artistic skills in a supportive environment. This course can help you find your niche or simply broaden your horizons. Whether you want to be a professional artist or explore your creativity, this course covers a range of studio areas including: drawing, colour theory and textiles.

Diploma of Visual Arts CUA51115

LOCATION Colac campus

DURATION Part-time, three years, one day a week

START DATE February

This course is ideal for people with an interest in developing practical, conceptual and interpretive skills as well as exploring the use of personal imagery. Students at the diploma level will investigate themes and refine their work into a cohesive body of work which will be exhibited at the end of year exhibition. Graduating students of the diploma are eligible for the Peter Lucas Award. Winners of this award receive a free exhibition at the Warrnambool Art Gallery. Studio areas include drawing and textiles.

Health + Community Services

INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT

Certificate III in Individual Support FREE TAFE

CHC33015

LOCATION Colac campus

DURATION Part-time, nine months, two days a week

START DATE February

The Certificate III in Individual Support (formerly Aged Care and Home and Community Care) is an entry-level qualification to work within the aged care, disability or home and community care sectors. This course gives you practical experience in providing person-centred support to people who may require it due to ageing, disability or illness. This course includes 120 hours of work placement.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Certificate III in Community Services FREE TAFE

CHC32015

LOCATION Colac campus

DURATION Part-time, nine months. Two days a week

START DATE February

This qualification provides an entry point to community services to work under supervision. This course offers an insight into the various areas of community services such as family support work, aged care, disability, mental health, drug and alcohol support. Graduates may find work in community service organisations, however the Certificate III in Community Services is intended as a pathway course to further qualifications.

DISABILITY

Certificate IV in Disability FREE TAFE

CHC43115

LOCATION Colac campus

DURATION Part-time, one year, two days a week

START DATE February

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients' homes, who provide training and support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing. Workers promote a person-centred approach, work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/ or coordinate a small team. This course includes industry experience with 120 hours of mandatory work placement.

Introduction to the National Disability Insurance Scheme 22469VIC

LOCATION Colac campus

DURATION Part-time, six weeks, one day a week

START DATE Throughout the year

This introductory short course is for people new to the disability sector and provides a pathway to further qualifications. It will provide an overview to direct support work, the NDIS and working with an NDIS participant. This accredited unit may be utilised as an elective in several other community service qualifications.

Hospitality

Certificate III in Hospitality (workplace based)

FREE TAFE SIT30616

LOCATION Workplace training, Portland and Colac campus

DURATION 12 months START DATE May

This course provides workers in the hospitality industry with the training required to develop their practical skills and experience to undertake a range of front of house hospitality tasks. The course is delivered online, in the classroom and makes use of the students' workplace experience.

Tourism

Certificate III in Tourism (workplace based)

FREE TAFE SIT30116

LOCATION Workplace, Colac campus DURATION Full-time, one year.

START DATE February

This qualification develops the skills and knowledge of those who are working in the travel and tourism industry and for a range of employers such as travel agencies, tour wholesalers, tour operators, inbound tour operators, tourist attractions, visitor information centres and other tourism businesses. This course makes use of the student's work-place experience and is supported by online and some workshop delivery.

Block One: Build U Block Two: Brand U

LOCATION Colac, Hamilton, Portland and

Warrnambool campus

DURATION Full-time, three weeks (each

block). Four days a week

START DATE Throughout the year

These two blocks of three-week programs will help young, registered job seekers aged 15-24 years to increase their employability skills and become job ready.

Build U will help you learn communication, teamwork, time management, problem solving, enterprise innovation and technology skills – all skills employers want.

In the **Brand U** block, you will learn advanced job hunting skills, interview skills, resume writing, harnessing social media platforms for employment purposes and cover letter skills. Industry awareness experiences will also be provided to help you explore which industry is right for you. On completion of these programs, you may enter an internship or gain paid work within an organisation.

START DATE Throughout the year

Through a supported environment with small class sizes, students engage in project based learning focused on both individual and group interests.

Responsible Service of Alcohol

Cost: \$90

If you are seeking employment in a licensed venue or applying for a liquor licence in Victoria, a Victorian Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) certificate is essential.

This short course provides all the training required to obtain an RSA certificate from the Victorian Commission for Gambling & Liquor Regulation (VCGLR).

Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation*

Cost: \$80

The delivery of this accredited unit provides the skills and knowledge required to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines and applies to anyone who may be required to provide CPR in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings. Pre-reading and knowledge tasks need to be completed prior to participating in the practical workshop.

Provide First Aid*

Cost: \$190

The delivery of this unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty and applies to anyone who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.

Provide an Emergency First Aid Response in an Education and Care Setting*

Cost: \$225

The delivery of this accredited unit provides the skills and knowledge for participants who are required to respond to a first aid emergency, including asthmatic and anaphylactic emergencies. The course applies to educators and support staff working within an education and care setting. This unit of competency may contribute towards approved first aid, asthma and anaphylaxis training under the Education and Care Services National Law, and the Education and Care Services National Regulations (2011).

Testing & Tagging of Portable Electrical Equipment*

Cost: \$315

In many workplaces, portable electrical appliances and equipment must be tested and inspected on a regular basis. Having the necessary skills to do this is essential in certain workplace roles. This short course provides hands-on training for non-electrical tradespeople, so they can maintain, test and tag portable electrical appliances used in the workplace.

Construction Induction Card*

Cost: \$195

If you work or are intending to work in the construction industry, occupational health and safety induction training is mandatory. This short course covers the skills and knowledge required to work safely in the construction industry. It is specifically designed to meet the requirements for registration and card issue by WorkSafe.

Operate and Maintain Chainsaws*

Cost: \$466

The safe handling and operation of handheld chainsaws.

Learn the skills you'll need to safely prepare, operate and maintain hand-held chainsaws in a work environment and essential knowledge of OHS and duty of care requirements.
